# A message from a TRUSTEE

s a trustee for many years at El Shaddai, I have personally witnessed the setting up and running of a round-the-clock center for abandoned street children across the region. It provides shelter, food, education, advice and support for children in a safe and caring environment. As far as I know, it is the only center in the state and region that has such comprehensive and compassionate programmes for victims of child trafficking and child labour.

Programmes include shelters, feeding program for children across the state, legal services, healthcare, counselling, training in hygiene, social skills, child rights and fully subsidized education up to college or vocational education, clothes etc.

The Trust maintains contact with the children even after passing out of El Shaddai homes, through an alumni organization and helps them to support themselves. That many ex-students of El Shaddai are now returning to give back to the organisation by offering their services to children in the homes is testament to how authentic El Shaddai is to its cause of helping street children.

In summary, I can vouch that El Shaddai has been on a mission to rescue thousands of street children and give them a better life which they have been faithfully doing over the past twenty plus years with excellence.

### The Making of Trailblazers

Children's Committee Meeting (CMC) is an initiative for the children to practice advocacy and develop leadership skills. This platform allows the children to own their responsibilities and safeguard the rights of their group members. Children are divided into 4 groups in each home and each group is overseen by a leader and an assistant. A captain is appointed to overlook the management of duties and responsibilities by the group leaders.

This pattern instils confidence in children and helps them to solve problems creatively, work in a team, and work collaboratively with others. We bring out the innate qualities of leadership in each child by adopting an egalitarian method.

Today's children are the leaders of tomorrow and we want to equip our children to have control of their lives and the ability to make things happen.



## The journey of street children to a better tomorrow EDUCATION

I Shaddai aims at breaking children out of the vicious cycle of poverty by empowering them with education and survival facilities.

Shanti Niketan School (SNS) imparts non-formal education to children from deprived backgrounds. Children flourish with our child-centered approach, catering to their holistic development to become successful and independent individuals.

Field workers from our day care centers impart basic education to children in slums with the aim of encouraging and motivating those who haven't experienced schooling and dropouts to be reintegrated into the formal education system. They also help parents to enrol their children into schools and provide continued assistance. We also provide tuition and non-formal education in the day care centers. Realizing the greater importance of English language in today's world, our field workers conduct vocational courses in spoken English.

We strive to make our aim of breaking the vicious circle of poverty into a reality by equipping the future generation.

### Always a step ahead!

We are continually looking at ways to impart learning among our children. Today, video conferencing helps our children learn lessons from across the world, a truly global education. The technology has improved and where we started the programme by using mobile phones and WhatsApp, we now use Skype or Google Hangout which enable children to see the story on a large screen in the library.

Finally, she tasted sweet victory when she completed her course and started working as an assistant. Soon she acted on her drive to start a clinic of her own. By this time, her family had come in terms with her decision and supported her in the little ways they could to fulfill her dream.

Today, she independently runs a clinic in Borda and extends her services to the community.

She was enrolled in Shanti Niketan School and continued her studies till 12th grade. After her schooling, she joined the head office of El Shaddai as an HR Assistant trainee. She pursued Public Administration at the age of

21. Soon she was made HR executive.

Little did she know, from the girl who stumbled on her English letters at 11, would end up as the Director of Administration at the age of 25, in the same institution which nurtured her throughout her childhood years. She wants to help more children like her, to have a better future. She humbles herself by dedicating all her success to Dada and Didi, as she calls Mr. Matthew Kurian and Julia Matthew.

She says, "my mother gave me birth, but this life today was gifted to me by El Shaddai and so I call myself, a daughter of El Shaddai".

A strategic impact assessment of El Shaddai was conducted in early 2019. assessment team qualitative scrutinised and quantitative evidence and used the 'depth of impact' framework to analyse the findings. The conclusion reached by Caplor Horizons is that El Shaddai has delivered inspirational, enduring and transformational changes in the lives of the current children, the former chil-

dren, the staff members and the communities that they have engaged with.



## A decade of commitment

y story begins in Gujarat, where I had a regular job. Whilst working, the place was hit by an earthquake and many lives were devastated. Many charities came forward to help the people. Inspired, I joined one as I wanted to do my bit for society.

Later, I decided to study further and so left for Delhi. It was here that I got to know about El Shaddai Charitable Trust.

I came to Goa in 2009 and met Mr. Matthew Kurian, Founder of El Shaddai. He saw the passion in me and offered me a job in Stepping Stones, a Day Care Center in Margao. Mr. Matthew had envisioned Stepping Stones to reach out to more children in and around the area. I took that as my goal and gave my best.

Initially I expected people in the community would support me as this was to help the children in need. But to my amazement I faced a lot of discouragement. I was de-motivated by the lack of support and felt it best to leave the job and continue with my regular job.

Mr. Matthew listened to me patiently. Then he told me not to let the passion I had for the children fade. I told him that it won't be possible to work in here as I do not know the local language and he said, "Children know only one language and that is \_\_\_\_\_

love".

This statement has kept me going. I decided that nothing can stop me from achieving my goal.

I worked to develop Stepping Stones and along with my team we enrolled hundreds of children so that we could give them basic education. We started schools

in the various slums around the shelter for those who couldn't come to the center.

Locals now support the work and businesses promote El Shaddai. It has been a tough ride but the outcome nullifies all the hardships.

When he joined Shanti Niketan, his first school, he joined the El Shaddai Sports & Cultural Club and was trained under the guidance of Coach Valentino. After playing a few matches at the club, he soon reached the 2nd division in the Goa state league.

During these games, Goa Football Development Council (GFDC) members identified his inborn instincts and were impressed with his skills. They selected him to play for the Goa U14 team, where he carved out a name with his match-winning goals.

Whilst Topon was playing for the U14 team, Ales, a coach, saw his potential and referred him to Dempo S.C. to play for the U14 club team.

Today Topon plays for Dempo S.C. and is always in the starting line-up of the team for all the matches. Topon has scored more than 25 goals in his career at Dempo S.C, and turns out as 'man of the match' quite often. He has disciplined himself to wake early and travel long distances just to get a good practice session with his team. Topon credits his father for cultivating a passion in him for the sport.


