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

Nurturing Dreams, Building Futures

OUR HOMES

Every child or individual dreams of having a home of their own. Not just for food and a place to sleep, but for safety, community, and most importantly, for love. As an alternative solution to orphanages, El Shaddai Homes were established from the very beginning in order to meet the needs of less fortunate children whose families are not able to care for them properly. Every child at El Shaddai's home is nurtured as he or she grows and expands. A warm environment, nutritious food, quality education, medical care, and safety are provided to these children. Children attend Shanti Niketan School, and some are also enrolled in formal schools. In an environment that feels like a family home, the children feel loved, and safe, and enjoy childhood experiences.

SHELTERS AND COMMUNITY CENTERS

We often hear terms like poverty, hunger, malnutrition, underprivileged, women inequality, and many others; these are the realities of the world and we ignore them. As a response to these realities, El Shaddai runs 8 shelters and community centres in the major cities of Goa, providing food, groceries, school kits, tarpaulins, medicine, skill training, etc. to the slum dwellers, street children, and abandoned.

As the nutrition gap widens, feeding programs play an important role in addressing children's hunger and malnutrition, ensuring food security.







HEALTHY COMMUNITIES, BRIGHTER FUTURE

Since its inception, El Shaddai has conducted a number of major medical camps and health awareness programs to provide access to medical care and generate awareness among the underprivileged. Primary Healthcare Centre (PHC) doctors and health specialists treat the people and children at the centres and shelters. The areas of medical care they cover are general, dental, and ophthalmology. In addition to providing free medical check-ups and medicines to rural communities, we also conduct awareness camps including mammography camps, eye camps, diabetes awareness programs, and AIDS awareness programs. Many people from the nearby communities attend these camps and benefit

from them. We want to reach out to more and more people who do not have access to quality health care through these camps.

When I came to El Shaddai, Didi provided shelter to me and my brothers and gave all the necessary requirements along with good education. Slowly my sister's children were also enrolled and they are currently studying in Shanti Niketan

School. My Grandmother also came for help and is given shelter in House of Hope. I completed my tenth std at Shanti Niketan school. The positivity at El Shaddai made me to believe in me that even I could serve the community. Today I am working as an Incharge at House of Hope.

We six of us grew in El Shaddai along

with my grandmother. Because of El Shaddai I had a place to find rehabilitation and hope. I am thankful to didi and dada for giving me an opportunity to be a part of this family.

JUNITA'S INSPIRING JOURNEY IN WUSHU

Junita, a 17-year-old girl from our Rainbow house, won the state-level Wushu competition and is now on her way to competing at the national level. This little girl, originally from Assam, has always been interested in athletics, but due to financial constraints, she was unable to pursue this interest. After completing her Tenth El Shaddai enrolled her at the Higher Secondary school in Mapusa, where her Physical Education instructor noticed her enthusiasm for athletics and encouraged her to practice

martial arts. In preparation for her trip to Bihar, her mentors Matthew Kurian and Julia Matthew encouraged her. Her dream is to win all the tournaments and one day become a coach and teach other children this new form of martial arts."





STITCHING DREAMS

Rukhya Kantrati, an 18-year-old native of Karnataka, finds her true calling at a young age, despite numerous obstacles in her life. As a Tenth-standard dropout from a migrant family, she always wished to do something and earn a living. Slowly, she came across Albert's Good News Center in El Shaddai and began to learn how to sew. At this centre, she started with tailoring classes and completed the program successfully. Meanwhile, she was able to gain steady clients and gain experience as a tailor. Her greatest achievement she says is "when people come back to her for more orders." The feeling is truly overwhelming and there are no words to describe it.



EMPOWERING THROUGH EDUCATION

Lighting the Path to a Brighter Tomorrow

The best way to address healthcare, poverty, population control, unemployment, and human rights is by providing education to children in need. "Each child has the right to education." Education not only equips children with the skills they need to have a secure future but also prepares them to become responsible citizens around the world. In the past, the school seemed like a distant dream to children from the poorer sections of society. Through the Shanti Niketan School and other 8 schools in Goa and Karnataka, El Shaddai works with children (3-18 years old) from difficult circumstances, children from poor families, streets, and from remote villages. Our schools are regularly attended by 830 children. The school addresses the challenges that prevent these children from receiving an education in their communities as part of their initiative. Through quality education, El Shaddai makes a difference in the lives of children from disadvantaged communities.

Through education these children will be

able to acquire the academic achievements they need to interpret life situations, develop critical thinking skills, and avoid social insecurity. El Shaddai has shown relentless commitment to making life better for children of disadvantaged communities by providing them with an education that will enable them to have a better future. El Shaddai Schools bridge the gap in formal education and opportunities for underprivileged children by providing basic literacy and numeracy skills. A total of 39 Slums schools operate in Goa where our outreach workers and volunteers strive to provide holistic education and life skills support.

Sarita was just 10 years old when her mother put her in Rainbow House. Due to financial difficulties, Sarita's mother was unable to take care of her and her six siblings. Her father walked out of her family, compounding her problems. Since 2014, Sarita has been with El Shaddai. Her desire to be a teacher was shaped by the love she received from her teachers. Through El Shaddai, she was offered the position of daycare teacher at First Steps soon after completing her SSC. She loves to teach her children in her favourite playway method. She is presently pursuing her 12th standard via distance learning.

Sunil's Journey from Despair to Deliverance

n 2006, I came to Goa with my brother from Rajasthan and started living in a small rented room near Margao railway **L** station. To make our living, my brother used to collect plastic bottles and sell them around the city. Later, I joined him so that we could meet our daily needs. Our next move was to Vasco, followed by Santacruz near Panjim. We did not know anyone in Goa who could help my brother to get a job or help me go to school. Someone from Santacruz, where we used to live, mentioned that I could attend a school located at Panjim in 2007. That was ASHADEEP and I first learned about El Shaddai. Upon entering the shelter, when I saw so many children playing, studying and enjoying themselves, I felt like staying there and not going home. We were asked to join the shelter the next day by the shelter staff. After that I never missed a single day going to Ashadeep because it was more than a shelter; it was my home where I found love and care and felt protected. As a result of my close connection, I even used to walk from Santacruz to Ashadeep many times.

In the same year, 2007 my brother requested the Asha Deep Incharge if they could help me with a home where I could stay and study. So without delay, I was taken to head office where I first saw Ps. Matthew (who is now known as my DAD). After a few days, Matthew (my DAD now) enrolled me in one of the homes at Assagao, called Shekinah House. During that time, I also received good support in other activities that allowed me to forget about my past and start a new life. As days passed I

became a part of a really good and huge family and I was so happy that I was being loved and cared for, which I did not receive in my childhood.

Upon completing 12th grade, I went for computer training, where I gradually learned how to reset, diagnose, and fix computers. Later I joined in El Shaddai office as a trainee and slowly started working



there only in the IT department and from there on I went on to work on different projects for El Shaddai. 15 years ago I remember an incident, I was separated from my family and recently I was able to locate them.

Today when I look back at my old life and compare it with today's life, I feel so Blessed and Happy that I have a Family like El Shaddai. I was provided with all that was needed to make me stand on my feet and grow in the right direction. Till today I am given support and help to move forward in life so that I have a good future ahead.

ADRAHALLI PROJECT

Bridging Gaps and Building Futures

Most children in villages do not attend school or drop out because of financial difficulties. So the children help at home by taming animals and caring for them, apart from taking care of their younger siblings. There are some children who also work to support their families. Children from rural and slum areas of Adrahalli, Karnataka, suffer from reduced literacy levels, child labor, and school dropout rates. As a way to help all such children. El Shaddai has started the Adrahalli Project, a Community Care Centre in Karnataka. At this center, children from this village receive free schooling and tuition. Currently, we have 70 girls and boys between the ages of 3 and 12.









Nurturing Dreams and Healing Hearts, One Paw at a Time

My name is Supriya Kerkar. Soon I will be turning 18. I was just 3 when I came to El Shaddai. We came to El Shaddai because we were experiencing many problems at home. Also, I have an elder sister named Sujata. Our journey began at El Shaddai. During my time at El Shaddai, I learned how to talk to people, how to dress up, and even how to speak English. Shanti Niketan School is where I completed my 10th grade.

Animals have always been a special part in my life since I was a child. Taking care of stray animals and treating their wounds is something I enjoy doing. Over the years, my bond with the animals just grew stronger. It has always been my dream to turn this passion for animal care into a career. When I was selected for the course of Veterinary Assistant at WVS (World Wide Veterinary Service), my happiness had no bounds. I am currently doing my training in animal care and service, and I am enjoying every minute of it. I am very thankful to Didi and

Dada for all the happiness they have given me.

THE RENA PROJECT

Illuminating Lives in Red Light Areas

In Mumbai, we started a new initiative named "The Rena project" which is a big boon for the children and women who live in the Red Light areas of Turbhe, Navi Mumbai, Badalapur and Bhandup districts. Health risks, exploitation, and vulnerability are common issues in red-light areas. Outreach workers at "The Rena Project" in Mumbai are doing significant work in sheltering children at home and empowering women with skill development programs. As part of the literacy program, the women are learning basics and are also receiving vocational training in tailoring, where they are learning to make beautiful bags. The mothers are also counselled so that they can enrol their children in our El Shaddai Home, and send them to school.

El Shaddai opened a children's

home, the Rena Home in Badalapur on August 2nd 2023. The new centre has currently enrolled fifteen children. To empower women and children to assert their rights and make a significant difference in 'their lives, we offer emotional support to the needy. Rather than living in unsafe and unhygienic conditions in the red light area, the children will now have a safe and secure place to live.

We have been providing homecooked, nutritious hot meals to the poor people and children of Goa through El Shaddai's "Manna Meals on Wheels" program. This year, we have served 200200 meals. For more than 25 years, we have been fighting hunger this way. Outreach workers visit bus stops, temples, and railway stations, among other places. Through the distribution of food to the homeless, this feeding program will improve health, reduce inequalities, and end hunger sustainably. We provide meals that not

only meet immediate needs but also empower the vulnerable for long-term change.

It's not just feeding the poor with food, we're feeding them love and kindness.







Stories of Change, Lives Regained

MYRA

Myra is a beautiful six-year-old girl hailing from West Bengal. Coming from a broken family with no proper home and food, she was filled with mixed emotions upon her arrival to our home when she received care, love and a sense of belongingness. Her transformation from a shy introverted girl to a bold and confident child began at El Shaddai. Myra is studying at our Shanti Niketan School and loves to write. Even during her free time she is often seen writing and trying her best to learn more and more.

TWINKLE

Twinkle was deprived of the most important bonding, "the mother –daughter bond". Even her siblings never got their mother's love. As a result, Twinkle retreated into a shell. She could not understand that, all this was happening, because her mother was mentally challenged. Her only hope was her Father but he too worked all day long as a labourer to make ends meet. But no matter how hard he tried he just could not manage to care for his wife and four children. But fate had other plans and Twinkle's life took a turn towards hope and

happiness. She is presently studying in Nursery class. She could not speak a single word in English but today

she stands confidently in front of her classmates and confidently reads using phonics. When asked her teachers what they have to say about her, they reply she is such a lovely child, well behaved, dedicated and confident. But above all Twinkle found the bond of Love at El Shaddai.

PRACHI

School is a place where we learn and grow, we make friends and memories. But life is not the same for all. Here is the story of a girl named Prachi who in her entire life had never been to school. Her mother toiled whole day and night working in the fields just so that she could put a few morsels of food on their plate. Her father did nothing to better her life and abandoned the family and re- married. With no proper place and food life was becoming very difficult but to her good fortune, she and her siblings were enrolled at El Shaddai. This was truly life changing for Prachi. She had never held a pencil in her hand, and was always seen crying in a corner. But now Prachi has learnt alphabets, numbers and has started with Phonics.

PUSHPANJALI

When Pushpanjali began receiving coaching from Sir Valentine, who primarily coached boys, at the age of 7, she developed passion for football. Throughout her life, she

was extremely active in various sports, consistently attending all practice sessions and displaying a strong interest in athletics. In the event that she was unable to attend practice, she would promptly request additional sessions from either her physical education teacher or Ma'am Julia. During holidays, she would even contact them using her sister's phone to arrange additional practice time.

Moreover, Pushpanjali has recently been selected for the State Goa Team and is proudly representing her state at the national level.



From Holiday to Heartfelt Volunteer



AN ENJOYABLE UNEXPECTED EYE-OPENING EXPERENCE

was on holiday in January 2017 in Goa wandering around Anjuna market and came across the El Shaddai stall. I took a leaflet after having a brief chat with someone and put it in my bag. When I got back to the UK, I found out that I was being made redundant from my role in the NHS and, still having the leaflet, I did some research and applied to be a volunteer for the following February 2018. I didn't know what to expect but I had the most enjoyable, eye-opening, thought-provoking and wonderful experience.

I was placed at Asha Deep Day Shelter in Panjim for a month and really enjoyed my time there, engaging with the children coming in on a daily basis visiting those out in the slums for slum school and doing the outreach and feeding programmes on the streets with the field workers. Everyone that I met was so welcoming and friendly, from the staff that I worked with to the children and families that I spent time with. Following on from that, I have volunteered several times, always being based at Asha Deep as that holds a special place in my heart - the last time being February 2023.

When the role of UK Office Co-ordinator came along, I jumped at the opportunity of becoming a permanent part of El Shaddai as I feel that it's such a worthwhile charity and, having been a volunteer, I can totally appreciate why, where and how we are helping to make a difference to so many lives.
