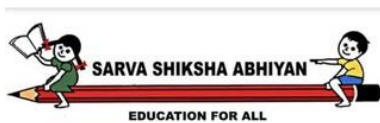



Kavya's story of Hope

The Goa slums were Kavya's world, a tapestry woven with the harsh scent of fish and the constant struggle for survival. At 13, she shouldered the weight of being the eldest of four sisters, their flimsy hut offering little protection from a life determined to break them. Their father, a memory more than a presence, had left them to the mercy of a world where education was a cruel joke. One day, whispers of hope cut through the despair. Whispers of El Shaddai, a place where dreams, like fragile flowers, dared to bloom. It began with a simple meal, a brief respite in the relentless chase for sustenance. But in the kind eyes dispensing food, Kavya glimpsed something more – a spark that ignited a defiance deep within her. El Shaddai's outreach workers, angels in worn sandals, recognized the silent plea in Kavya's eyes. They saw beyond the grime and the hunger, a yearning for a different life. School, once a whispered fantasy, became a reality. The dust-caked streets gave way to classrooms, their minds thirsty for knowledge like parched earth craves rain. Today, Kavya's laughter rings through the safe haven of El Shaddai's care home, a melody replacing the hollow clang of begging bowls. Her mother, finally receiving the support she craved, watches with tear-filled eyes as Kavya runs free. Not to escape hunger, but towards a future brimming with possibilities. El Shaddai isn't just a charity; it's a bridge across the chasm of despair, a hand outstretched to say, "There's another way," and a gentle nudge that empowers young minds to dream again. Project Background

Mumbai represents the largest brothel-based sex industry in India, with more than 5,000 sex workers. These sex workers are predominantly located in Kamathipura, Asia's largest red-light area. Many of these women grow up in low-income families and are sold into sex work as minors by family members, neighbors, or strangers. These minor girls are typically trafficked from other states of India, as well as from neighboring countries such as Nepal and Bangladesh



Living conditions in Kamathipura are deplorable for sexworkers who have little access to basic needs, such as food, housing, clothing, hygiene, and health care. Kamathipura is not just the largest, but the oldest and most infamous, red-light district. Kamathipura is divided into lanes, and each lane is crowded with small huts, tea stalls, shops, lodges, pawnshops, eating joints, and brothels. More than 40% of sex workers in Kamathipura are homeless. They live on the streets, on the footpaths and pavements.

Aim – To Provide a safe and Healthy Environment for the Women from Kamathipura Area and a chance at them living a normal life. To ensure that these rescued women are given all the necessary help and support to choose a way other than being a sex worker
