

A NEW BEGINNING FOR FATIMA

Case Study

Marriage is a blessing—something that everyone looks forward to-where two individuals find hope and love. 19-year-old Fatima from Mumbai, never imagined that her life after marriage would take such a sharp, treacherous turn. She was married off by her mother, who works in a brothel. Her husband had an extramarital affair. continuously molested her, and never looked after her appropriately. They had a child and named her Alina (name changed). When Alina was eighteen months old, Fatima, now 21 years old, decided that Alina is not in safe hands and she could no longer suffer at the

hands of her husband and decided to do something about her situation. She needed to take care of herself and her child.

However, the decision she made was even more damaging, which was to work at a brothel along with her mother. Our outreach team was informed about Fatima, and they immediately met her and informed her of Rena home, where she would be safe. The happy ending to this story is just the beginning of Fatima's new life at Rena home.

OUR HOMES



El Shaddai Children's Homes care for children from very poor backgrounds, slums streets, broken families and highly vulnerable and economically desperate conditions. Every home has a homely atmosphere with good facilities. Most importantly, the children receive much needed love and care from trained care takers who care for the children as their own.

OUR SHELTERS AND COMMUNITY CENTRES



El Shaddai runs shelters and centres across Goa and Karnataka ensuring needy children living in poverty get proper meals.

FROM STUDENT TO A BUSINESS MAN

My name is Raju Naik and I would like to briefly share the story of my life. I want to tell you the truth about how my life was, what it is now, and what it would be if El Shaddai hadn't educated me. This is not any scripted story but it's the truth.

I still don't remember how old I was back then when I was picked up from the street of a small village along with my brother and a few other kids by an orphanage called, El Shaddai Street Child Rescue. They played a very important role in my life. We were handed to them by our parents because our parents couldn't afford to look after us. To

be honest, I was born in a cow shed so you can imagine how bad it was.

What my life is today has a lot to do with my upbringing. And as far as I remember, my entire upbringing was in an orphanage called El Shaddai, until I was 15 years old. Today, I can proudly say that I was given the best education, food, clothing, and shelter. I was also taught how to survive in this lonely world.

I am who I am today thanks to El Shaddai street child rescue. If It was not for El Shaddai street child rescue, my life would be completely different.



I can't even imagine that scenario. I would probably be working as a laborer or I would be a Shepherd boy, Or, maybe would be a farmer but I would definitely be an illiterate man. There have been a lot of struggles along the way to get here. I am still not where I want my life to be but I am getting there. I am proud of how far I've come. I want to Thank God for supporting me all along the way.

I also wish to Thank my elder brother, Ravi Naik. He has always been there like my shadow, looking after me. He is the only family I have. He was also there with me in the Orphanage. El Shaddai street child rescue has taught us so much and we can proudly say that we had the best childhood.

Thank you Ms Anita Edgar, Mr Matthew Kurian, Mrs Julia Kurian and all the teachers over the years who had a role to play in my life. Thank you for your time invested it in me. I realise now how important that was. I can never repay you all for what you've done but I will make you all proud.

I was impressed by how 92% of funds go directly to projects, with only 6% on admin and 4% on marketing. ANNUAL HIGHLIGHTS

POCA

The Prevention of Child Abuse Program, was a comprehensive initiative organised by the El Shaddai Charitable Trust in Goa. It spanned 19 days from 1st November to 19th November 2023 and aimed to create awareness. educate, and empower the community to help prevent child abuse. El Shaddai conducted 19day activism programme including cycle rallies, silent rallies and road shows that focused on preventing violence against children. These children have endured significant challenges that have impacted their physical, emotional, mental, and spiritual well-being.

The shelters, community centres, schools and homes raised awareness about child abuse and its consequences.





The campaign helped by educating children, parents, and community members about identifying and preventing child abuse. They also empowered children with knowledge about their rights and safety measures, and in this way created a supportive community environment for abuse victims.

Feedback from participants indicated a significant increase in knowledge about child protection, Thus proving that the programme was highly successful. As part of the Child Abuse Prevention Program, El Shaddai Charitable Trust made a significant contribution to the fight against child abuse in Goa.

As a preventative measure, El Shaddai will continue to build the narrative of hope for children.

GOA MARATHON

The Goa Marathon, an annual event organized to raise awareness, and provide homes and hope for underprivileged children, took place on Sunday, February 18, 2024. This year's marathon was a remarkable success, promoting health and fitness as well while supporting a noble cause.

The event catered for runners of all skill levels, from first-time marathon runners to veterans and walkers. Participants of all ages contributed to raising awareness for the El Shaddai Charitable Trust's vital work.

It was inspiring to see our UK and Indian trustees running for such a meaningful cause. The Goa Marathon, organized by the El Shaddai Charitable Trust, achieved its primary objective of fundraising for child welfare, while also fostering a strong sense of community.

The overwhelming response and positive feedback have set a robust precedent for future events.

FIGHTING VITAMIN A DEFICIENCY



Vitamin A deficiency remains a significant public health concern, particularly among children in low-income communities and slum areas. To address this, El Shaddai Charitable Trust provided Vitamin A supplements to 3,000 children, significantly reducing health complications related to this deficiency.

El Shaddai raised awareness among caregivers about the importance of Vitamin A in children's diets.

We also educated caregivers, thereby improving the overall nutritional status and health of the community. Efforts were also made to raise awareness by organizing health camps by providing health care services. different sessions about hygiene practices and disease prevention measures to combat prevalent health issues.

Our outreach workers, equipped with knowledge of children's rights and life-saving vaccines, are on a continuous mission to find young mothers and infants in their area to ensure that no child is left behind.

Shanti Niketan School has around 51 new children from the streets, slums, and underprivileged backgrounds enrolled this year. Our school has received



official government recognition. We currently have 300 students ranging from Nursery to National Institute of Open Schooling (NIOS).

BLOOMING BUDS



Currently serving 600 children, Blooming Buds in Karnataka is making significant progress in providing comprehensive education and support, ensuring that each child receives the care and resources they need to thrive.

They have also introduced new



A BRIGHTER & SUSTAINABLE FUTURE

Case Study

Rekha, from Solapur, Maharashtra, was married at 12 and had a son. Over time, her husband became an alcoholic and abusive, leading her to move to Mumbai when her son was 6. There, she was forced into prostitution at Kamathipura. After 7 years, she entered a relationship and remarried, placing her son in a children's home for better care. Tragically, her second husband passed away in 2024, leaving her struggling to survive.

Her case was referred to our organization, and she has now safely relocated to our Rena Shelter

for Women. At 34, Rekha has a promising future, and El Shaddai is honored to support her on this journey.



Shahana Haji

Shahana Haji, a young woman from the Chimbel slums, faced many hardships after her family moved from Karnataka. Her father, a laborer, struggled to support them. However, her life changed when our outreach workers introduced her to our center that empowers women.

Driven by a desire to learn, Shahana joined our Mehendi classes, inspired by the success stories of other women. She completed a three-month course, mastering various Mehendi patterns, including Arabic, simple, and intricate bridal designs. Soon,

she became an expert, taking orders for bridal Mehendi and providing financial support for her family, including her younger brothers' education.

Shahana's journey has given her confidence and a strong bond with her customers. She feels empowered, knowing she can support her family and help others with her talents. Her story highlights the transformative power of skills development and the importance of providing opportunities for women to explore their potential.

Writing lesson plans, assessing class knowledge, and relating to students who are slow learners, this was common throughout my grades. As a teacher, I have had sometimes emotional and sometimes very gratifying experiences during the 23 years.

I can jot down one such experience when one of my 10th grade passed out with 99% and Julia sent me a message that read as follows "You are like old wine that is maturing as the years pass by." Teaching is a challenging job but a positive point is that the love you get from your students is unparalleled.

Matthew Kurian's Camino de Santiago Walk






