The El Shaddai Charitable Trust is a registered, non-profit, non-sectarian and non-religious Charity started by Anita Edgar and Matthew Kurian. El Shaddai operates in Goa and other States in India, implementing the Child Rights Act 2003/05 for orphans, street children, and children coming from economically desperate conditions.

Here the underprivileged children and destitute women are cared and provided with food, clothing, shelter, and education, for a better future. We have seven residential Homes, three Day Care Centres, three Community Centres, Destitute Women's shelter, Destitute Men's Shelter, four schools, and Cottages for seniors who are attending University, Colleges, Technical Institutions and Professional Training Centres & working.

We have Meals on Wheels, Manna Khana free food distribution programme running on a daily basis. Manna takeaway packets are provided for around 700 poor and needy children and adults living on the streets. We have a Community Sponsorship Programme for the financially challenged children. We have 39 slum schools and slum outreach programmes which provide educational facilities and community health camps for the slum children and women.



How you can Volunteer

The role of volunteers is vital in providing individual attention to the children most in need.

- 1. **Hands-On Assistance**: Engage directly with the children and women we serve by volunteering at our schools, shelters, or community centers, eg: helping children in their studies, tuitions,
- 2. **Skill-Based Contributions**: If you have specific skills, such as teaching, healthcare, or administrative expertise, your talents can benefit our programs and operations. eg: helping teachers in arts, crafts, dressmaking, using healthcare and health educational skills, some help in sports, cricket, football and volleyball coaching. A great favourite is working in our slum school.
- 3. **Fundraising and Outreach**: Help us raise funds, spread awareness, and engage with donors to support our initiatives, eg; help at our stall at Wednesday Anjuna Flea market and our Saturday and Sunday beach programme.

What is expected from Volunteers?

- **Commitment**: Dedicate your time and energy as agreed upon.
- **Compassion**: Show empathy and respect for those we serve.
- **Teamwork**: Collaborate with our staff and other volunteers.
- Adaptability: Be flexible and ready to contribute where needed.

Spoken English is required in order to communicate effectively with us and children.

(We have a responsibility to ensure all volunteers who work with us have a clear police check, this is in line with our Child Protection policy).

A good level of spoken English

(Most of our children and staff have a good level of spoken English, so to enable communication; a good level of spoken English is a requirement).

El Shaddai Policy

It is mandatory to comply with the following:

Dress Code

- To wear your ID badges at all times on site (this will be provided when you arrive, during your Induction).
- Always wear suitable clothing whilst around our staff and children (cover your shoulders and knees).
- We will provide 2 t-shirts; these must be worn at all times whilst on duty with either three quarter or long trousers or skirt (not mini).
- When on beach duty, ladies should wear a top El Shaddai t-shirt with shorts over your bikini/swimsuit. Men should wear swimming shorts, not trunks and a top - El Shaddai t-shirt.
- Always remove your shoes when entering our Homes.
- Smoking and/or drinking of alcohol is NOT PERMITTED when on duty.

Favouritism, Do's and Don'ts

It is often difficult during your time with the children not to have "favourites". We always insist all children are treated in the same way, so please do not give anything to one child if you are not able to give to all the children in the Centre.

Please do not give any gifts or items to a child without first consulting the House In Charge or another member of staff in their absence. No gifts to staff or visits to staff homes as this may cause difficulties. Please be sensitive to local culture at all times – remember, if a single girl is left unchaperoned with a man, they are considered to have been defiled and the family may disown them or worse.

Goa is one of the most westernized States in India, as well as being a highly lucrative tourist area. English is widely spoken and many westernized values and ideas influence daily life. However, the majority of our children come from other States, which have not been exposed to many of the western values we take for granted. The same applies to many of our staff and we would always ask you to be respectful and sensitive to their views and culture at all times.

DO NOT offer to take the children anywhere or spend time alone with a child without a member of staff being present as this is against our Child Protection Policy.

We are always ready to listen to new ideas; should you have any suggestions, queries or problems during your stay, please write them down and put them in the suggestion box provided or contact your Volunteer Co-ordinator.

Please DO NOT discuss problems or complaints with the house staff or children as this may cause distress or start rumors. Please come directly to Matthew, Julia or Sponsorship secretary.

Obviously, we want you to remember the primary objective of your visit is to support the children and their welfare must always be your first priority. Please respect there are sometimes very different ways of doing things in India to where you may come from!

Towards the end of your Volunteer Services you will be asked to complete an 'End of Volunteer Questionnaire' this will give you an opportunity to voice your opinions or any concerns you may have.

Please complete the 'End of Volunteer Service Questionnaire' which will be given to you by our Volunteer Coordinator.
