EL SHADDAI'S IMPACT: CHANGING LIVES, ONE CHILD AT A TIME

El Shaddai Homes continues its mission to provide shelter, education, healthcare, and empowerment to children and vulnerable communities. This report outlines the impact of our initiatives, demonstrating how we are transforming lives through dedicated efforts and community support.

204 children currently reside in our El Shaddai Homes, receiving care, education, and support. **61,648** cooked meals served to children and individuals in need. **3,978** children were provided access to education. **2,707** individuals benefitted from medical awareness programs. **1,319** women supported through skill development and empowerment programs. **300** families received groceries to sustain their livelihood

HOMES UPDATE

On 7th December, children from Rainbow and Shekinah House attended the India Bike Gathering, witnessing exciting rides and stunts. Junita, Pushpanjali, and Laxmi C participated in the State-Level Wushu Competition in Coimbatore and the Interstate Badminton Competition.

Christmas celebrations brought joy and warmth to all children in their homes.

SHELTERS & COMMUNITY CENTRES

10 homeless men, **15** homeless women in Goa and **6** homeless women in Mumbai are currently residing in our shelters, receiving care and support.

MEDICAL & NUTRITION SUPPORT



732 children received deworming tablets as part of National Deworming Day.

15 tarpaulin sheets distributed to impoverished families in Mapusa slum in collaboration with the Lion's Club. 150 children and their families received dry ration to sustain their livelihood.

126 women participated in empowerment programs like tailoring, computers, adult literacy, and Mehndi designing, equipping them with valuable skills for self-sufficiency.

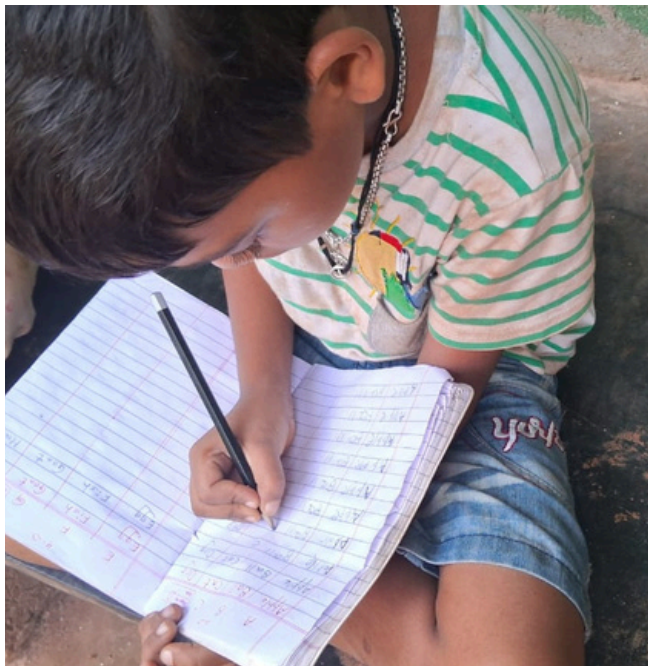

EDUCATION IMPACT



34 new children enrolled at the start of the new academic year in June. Children's Day was celebrated, bringing joy and learning experiences. NIOS children visited the Indian Navy Workshop in Vasco, gaining practical exposure. **1,177** children are currently studying at El Shaddai Schools in Goa and Karnataka.



1,000 underprivileged children are receiving quality education at 21 Slum Schools across North and South Goa. On 24th January, the Annual Sports Day at Shanti Niketan School and Annual Blooming Buds Celebration took place, attended by 3,000 parents, reinforcing the importance of holistic education.

VARSHA JOURNEY: FROM FEAR TO SAFETY AT EL SHADDAI

Please take a moment to read the moving story of Varsha and know the difference you enable us to make in a child's life -



On 6th November, 2024, our team visited an area of Mumbai, India. In the slums of this area, our outreach team met 4-year-old Varsha. She was alone at home. Her mother had to leave to work early in the morning and would only return in the evening. Varsha's father had passed away in a train accident. While her mother was at work, 4 year old Varsha had to fend for herself, alone.

When Varsha was 3 years old, she was raped and abused by a 19 year old boy in the area. Her mother tried to go to the police but the boy was well connected with mobsters and they threatened the lives of Varsha and her mother. Varsha and her mother had no one to protect them and help them fight for justice.

This is when Varsha's mother approached our shelter to find some safety. Varsha was admitted at our Rena Home for Children on 9th November 2024. Now, Varsha is safe and protected at our shelter. Her mother is also happy and relieved that her child is finally safe and can have a chance at a brighter future.
